As for 2013, Year of the Italian Culture in the United States, we will also be present with two concerts of the Accademia del Teatro alla Scala Orchestra directed by Maestro Daniele Rustioni, that will take place in December at the Chicago Harris Theater and at the Strathmore Hall in Washington. The program includes of course the great Italian Opera tradition: Verdi, Puccini, Rossini, Donizetti.
